Kane County Health Department to Open Maple Park Vaccination Clinic on May 22

May 17, 2021 – To reach out and extend vaccination services to western Kane County rural residents and students, the Kane County Board and Health Department are partnering with the Visiting Nurses Association to open a pop-up vaccination clinic in the Village of Maple Park from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 22, at 302 Willow Street, Maple Park, IL 60151. The Pfizer vaccine will be distributed.

“Kane County continues to increase opportunities for everyone to receive their COVID-19 vaccination,” said Corinne Pierog, Kane County Board Chairman. “We have established four regional vaccination sites to best serve our communities in Batavia, Aurora, Elgin, and Carpentersville. We will hold pop-up vaccination sites, like the one in Maple Park, throughout the County in the coming weeks. While we are enjoying the nice weather and the reopening of businesses and events, it is critically important that we get as many people vaccinated as possible to protect the most vulnerable segments of our population. If you are 12 years of age or older, please consider getting your vaccination today. You can make your appointment online at [KaneVax.org](https://www.kanevax.org) or take advantage of our new walk-in vaccination opportunities.”

“As the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Illinois Department of Public Health lift their recommendations on masks, it is important to encourage and remind everyone, if they haven’t, to consider receiving the vaccine,” said Suzanne Fahnstock, Maple Park Village President. “The Village of Maple Park will bring a one-day vaccination pop-up event to the Maple Park Civic Center on March 22. Please take this opportunity to encourage your friends and family to get their vaccinations.”

“We are excited to be working with our community partners to bring clinics to more people at sites that are convenient for them,” said Kathy Fossier, Interim Executive Director at the Kane County Health Department.

“Just as we did with our Kaneland staff, we look forward to working with the Kane County Health Department and Maple Park to support the vaccination efforts for our students ages 12 to 17,” said Dr. Todd Leden, Superintendent, Kaneland School District. “We hope to use this opportunity as a springboard to expand these vaccination efforts to other Kaneland communities.”

“These pop-up clinics are a logical next step in Kane County's successful efforts, along with our partners, to make the vaccine easily available to all our citizens,” said Drew Frasz, County Board Member.
